
NATIONAL SEMINAR on WATER RESOURCE AND HEALTH HAZARDS IN RAJASTHAN:

CHALLENGES AND INITIATIVES

13th - 14th March, 2015



Water is universally accepted as a symbol of life as it is the most crucial for maintaining an environment and ecosystem conducive to sustaining all forms of life. The available surface and ground water resources, which is part of a larger ecological system, are renewable but limited. India has 16 per cent of the world population where as the water resources are only 4 per cent. United Nations General Assembly recognized the right of every human being to have access to sufficient water for personal and domestic uses, which must be safe, affordable and physically accessible. The main reason is protection of health and well-being of the people and the environment .It also affects livelihood as productive working days of earning members are lost due to their sickness or in taking care of sick members of the household and they thus get trapped in the vicious cycle of poverty.

Owing to water shortage and escalating fertilizer costs, farmers are using raw sewage to irrigate and fertilize their cultivable land particularly near urban areas. When this water is used for irrigation, farmers' risk absorbing disease-causing bacteria, as do consumers who eat the produce raw and unwashed. This leads to numerous deaths each year because of diarrhea-related diseases, including cholera, according to WHO statistics.

Similarly, drinking water quality -surface as well as groundwater, has been a major issue due to systematic deterioration because of indiscriminate practices of waste disposal and lack of conservation initiatives against pollution.

Rajasthan, the largest state in the country with more than 10.5 per cent of the country's geographical area, supporting more than 5.5 per cent of the human population and 18.70 per cent of the livestock has only 1.16 per cent of the total surface water available in the country. Rainfall is subject to high degree of variability, inadequacy and uncertainty due to climatic conditions in the state. The availability of water is thus limited but its demand is increasing rapidly due to growing population, rapid urbanization and rapid industrialization and economic development.

There is an intense competition for fresh water resources in the state – primarily between agricultural and domestic uses. Water tables continue to fall at an unprecedented rate and groundwater is still continuously being mined at an unsustainable scale in 60 per cent of Rajasthan's 237 community development blocks; extraction of water from the ground is actually exceeding the replenishment, which means the state is digging into fossil water which has been inherited over hundreds of centuries. This is threatening water security.

ABOUT THE SEMINAR

The Seminar primarily focuses on issues related to water resources and health by taking a holistic view from demand and supply for various developmental activities at watershed level to river basin level, from a small village to a big city of Rajasthan.

The seminar promotes a dialogue among representatives from different sectors and allows them to present their beliefs about which areas may merit further function. The aim of our activities is to create possibilities for sharing knowledge, increasing co-operation and research.


