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SECULARISM AND NATIONALISM IN CONSTITUTIONAL DEMOCRACY

India has a colorful tradition, rich in values and virtues with its glorious past. Unity in diversity makes the country a cultural hub of the world. Multi-religious, multi-cultural and multi-lingual Indian society has cherished this heritage since ages. It is a land that professes and practices the noble ideals of Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam, SarveBhavantuSukhinath and Sanithana Dharma as well as Gandhi's Ahimsa. It is a common fact that people of diverse religion and sects including Turkish, Arabian, Persian, Jews, Mughal and Christian, came to India and settled here. This is a testimony of India's endurance and tolerant nature. This reflects the culture of common brotherhood being practiced in India. In addition to it the Constitution of India is inspired from various countries. The Constitution of India planted seeds of communal harmony by resolving to constitute India into a secular and democratic country. It promised its citizens, the liberty of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship, right to freedom of speech and expression and right to freedom of religion as well as the duty to abide by Constitution, protect the sovereignty, unity and integrity of India, spread the religious, linguistic and sectional brotherhood. In *Bijoe Emmanuel and Others v. State of Kerala and Others, AIR 1987 SC 748*, the Bench unanimously observed that our tradition, philosophy and Constitution have practiced humanity in letter and spirit. In *Aruna Roy v. Union of India AIR 2002 SC 3176*, Supreme Court emphasized that "truth, peace, love and non-violence are the basic foundation of education".

However, India has been a tolerant nation but still it does not guarantee its absolute compliance in harmony without conflict. After the independence of India, few instances occurred like Communal Riots in Punjab, Bombay, Godhra and Muzaffarnagar, Agitation for Reservation in Rajasthan, Gujarat and Haryana; Demands for Separate States, yet they fail to shake the unique foundation of this multi-cultural society. By and large, India still continues to be a country practicing tolerance. However, in the past years, incident like as Dadri incident in violation of Article 51-A that we are abide by constitution and we promote the spirit of religious and regional diversity, Attack on Tamil Author Perumal Murgan, Salman Rusdie Issue in violation of Article 19, and Returning of literary awards shook everybody. Parliamentarians started commenting that we are losing our spirit of Vashudev Katumbkam. Media also hyped the issue and entire country seemingly jumped into debate. In the light of above background the University Law College, Jaipur proposes to convene a One Day National Seminar to discuss above mentioned issue in the light of constitutional provision including fundamental duties provided in Article 51-A as well as Fundamental Rights insured in Part-III of Constitution of India.

SIGNIFICANCE OF THE SEMINAR

The issue proposed for the seminar holds relevance issue in a multicultural country like India. Looking into the ongoing debate over cultural diversity in India, a discussion among the intelligential from various field is a need of hour to share thoughts on the reality and gravity of this issue.

It is necessary because the kind of incidents which are responsibility for the debate are recurring, there is a tendency to give political color to our spirit of harmony for political gains and the role of media to put forward the reality behind this is also in doubt. The seminar aims at providing a platform where experts can share their views on theme and sensitize people. It is certainly going to be a multi-dimensional talk. The subject matter of the debate is not confined to communal riots but it encompasses the question of fundamental rights as well as understanding sensitization and awareness about our fundamental duties.
