

University of Rajasthan, situated in the heart of Jaipur the Pink City, was established in 1947 as a multi-faculty University. UGC has awarded the University with A Grade and recognized the University amongst the top 10 Indian Universities with Potential for Excellence (UPE) in 2012. It is the oldest University of Rajasthan and its main objective has been the creation and dissemination of knowledge. Its mission is Creation and Strengthening of Infrastructure for Global Competence and establish Academic links / collaboration with national and International institutions. The University provides Research facilities supported by the UGC-SAP, CAS, UPE, DST-FIST, PURSE, DST-SAIF programme grants. Backed up with good infrastructure, the University is hub of academic and Research activities.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

The subject of Public Administration was first started in 1957 in the department of Economics. Later on in 1965 a full fledged separate P.G. Department of Public Administration was established and housed in Social Science block. It has produced a large number of Academicians, Administrators, Professionals and Activists. A Special Assistance Programme SAP-DRS Phase-II has been sanctioned by University Grants Commission (UGC) to the department for the period of 5 years (2013-18). The thrust area of the SAP is "Urban, Governance and Development: Comparative Perspective". The Department has the privilege of hosting special lectures by eminent scholars from India and abroad.

The Centre for Local Self Government Studies was established during IXth five year plan. The Centre is organizing Conferences, Seminars, Lectures related to Public Administration in general and Local issues in particular.





Most of the societies are undergoing the crisis of governance. Public Administration is the most important tool for mitigating such a crisis through formulating and implementing Public Policy in every society. It generates inputs for framing a viable and effective Public Policy and for its effective execution. It also generates feedback through monitoring, implementation and evaluation of the public policy so as to introduce meaningful reforms and changes. The public policy was meant to serve the colonial-imperial interest during the colonial period and, thus, the public administration had been evolved in consonance with such an interest. The administration so evolved was not considered consistent with the new requirements and needs of the post-colonial society. The policy focus, thus, has been changed from line-administration to the participatory administration which has often been described as development administration in which peoples participation has become more important than just efficient administering. Obviously, the focus, role and contribution of Public Administration have changed from elitist to pro-people. It has necessitated major structural and procedural changes in the Public Administration to suit the developmental needs of the democratic society.

The scholars at the University of Rajasthan felt such a need long back and established a separate Post-graduate Department of Public Administration on the University Campus Fifty Years back. Since then the Department of Public Administration has grown by leaps and bounds in the University and the discipline of public administration flourished by introducing undergraduate and post-graduate courses in most of the Universities and Colleges in Rajasthan. However, there has been hardly any assessment and evaluation of the evolutionary process, role and contribution of the Public Administration as a discipline. Thus, the Department of Public Administration at the University of Rajasthan proposed to organize a Three-day Golden Jubilee International Seminar on the theme "Governance, Public Policy and Public Administration".

The Seminar is an effort to explain and understand the process and structures of governance for which the role and contribution of Public Administration must be revisited. Infact India is known for poor level of governance and slow pace of development during last 70 years. It is therefore imperative to explain how public administration as a discipline has evolved in assessing the development and how the development process and product have delivered public goods to the people. There are some of the important questions needs to be answered. The interaction between development process/practice and public administration as a discipline has opened new vistas of social knowledge because changing developmental requirements have posed serious

challenges before the conventional public administration which was modelled for undertaking formal kind of studies. The Department of Public Administration at the University of Rajasthan has converted such challenges into opportunities and revamped itself to change its course contents, research focus and sharpen the tools and techniques of research in Public Administration. It has resulted into ample research output based on scientific methods and empirical investigation by applying latest tools and techniques of data collection and analysis but it is not sufficient in discovering the rules and operational dynamics of the development policy which is continuously changing through popular demands and legislative enactments. However, the issues of the level and effectiveness of governance and sound public policy formulation are still important challenges before the Public Administration.

The Golden Jubilee Seminar is thus proposed to explain the interaction among governance, public policy and Public Administration for effective governance in the country. It will reveal the intricacies involved in the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of public policy and responsiveness of the Public Administration both as a discipline and as an activity. The Papers have thus been sought from the scholars and professionals from Public Administration and other disciplines on any of the following themes:









- Indicators and standards of effective governance.
- Challenges and problems of good governance.
- Public policy framing process in a democratic society
- · Social diversity and limits of inclusive policy
- Role of information and communication technology in framing and implementing policy and enabling good governance.
- Democratization and pressing demands for inclusive development.
- Legislative measures for people-centric development.
- Contesting policies and negotiating options for sustainable development and harmonious society.
- Role and Contribution of Public Administration as a Discipline in monitoring, implementing and evaluating development programmes and schemes.
- Scope of administration in undertaking and analysing sector specific policies (health, education, agriculture, industry, environment, labour, consumer, women, children etc.) and their aggregate governance.
- Specific case studies conducted by scholars in relation to formulation, implementation and evaluation of public policies at the National, State and local levels.
- Role and contribution of the Department of Public Administration at the University during last Fifty Years.
- Scope and limits of Scientific research in Public Administration in understanding, evaluating and introducing sound development practice and enforcing good governance.
- The future of Public Administration as a discipline.

The above themes are just suggestive and scholars may write their paper on any of the above topics and related aspects.

The scholars are requested to contribute a research paper on above mentioned topics. The full length paper should be of 3000-5000 words. The abstract of 250-350 words (in English font: Times New Roman, Font size 12 / in Hindi font: DevLys 10, Font size 14) should be submitted latest by March 20th, 2017 through an e-mail attachment in MS-Word to:


