Growing population, pollution, migration, regional inequality, unemployment, health & sanitation are few of many challenges in the face of rapid economic and urban growth. This cost of urbanization needs in-depth analysis and understanding of the phenomena. It is imperative for academicians and research scholars to delve into these growing concerns for the welfare of the society.

In Sustainable Development Goals 11, attention has given on the creation of Sustainable Cities and Communities for making cities and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable. It is common acceptance that cities are the engines of growth and are drawing large number of people from rural areas. Government of India has also introduced the concept of 'smart cities'. 
There are four broad thematic sessions on which scholars are invited to present their papers based on original piece of research.


