## Substituted Ordinance 251 in Chapter XXXIV (B.A., LL.B. (Hons.))

- “(1) There shall be an integrated Five years (Ten semesters) course for the degree of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) The examination for each paper in each semester shall be :-
- A. Term written examination. At the end of the semester - 50 marks
- B. Internal awards
- (i) Weekly tests - 20 marks
- (ii) Project work and presentation thereon - 10 marks
- (iii) Case law study through Moot Courts/  
Court Visits - 10 marks
- (iv) Attendance and conduct of the student - 10 marks
- (2) A candidate, who passed 10+2 examination with 50% marks in aggregate shall be eligible for admission to B.A., LL.B (Hons.) I Semester class, provided that he is not of more than 21 years of age on 1<sup>st</sup> July in the year in which admission is sought i.e. (For the academic year 2010-2011 his date of birth should not be before 1<sup>st</sup> July, 1989. But a candidate belonging to SC/ST obtaining a minimum of 45% marks in aggregate in the qualifying examination shall be considered eligible for admission to the said class;
- (3) The admissions will be made through an Entrance Test to be conducted by the University, comprising of a written test, personal interview and group discussion.
- (4) A candidate admitted to Five Years (10 Semester Course) for the degree of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Five Year Law Integrated Course has to complete his study within 8 academic years from the academic year in which he has first taken admission.
- (5) A candidate would have two additional chances to clear the due papers in immediate subsequent examinations when conducted for the same paper as per the syllabus then in force, failing which he has to clear all the papers of that semester as an ex-student.
- (6) A candidate, who has passed any one semester term examination in not less than four papers by securing at least 40% marks in each of those four papers and at least 50% marks in the aggregate of those papers shall be eligible for admission to the next semester. OR A Candidate who has appeared in any one semester term examination and the result has not been declared, may be eligible for provisional admission to the next semester, if the teaching has commenced but such provisional admission shall stand cancelled if he could not get the requisite eligibility on the declaration of his result of the term examination in which he has appeared.
- (7) A candidate who has completed a regular course of study in the I semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) I semester term examination.
- (8) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester I and has completed a regular course of study of the II Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) II Semester examination.
- (9) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester II and has completed a regular course of study of the III Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) III Semester examination.

- (10) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester III and has completed a regular course of study of the IV Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) IV Semester examination.
- (11) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester IV and has completed a regular course of study of the V Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) V Semester examination.
- (12) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester V and has completed a regular course of study of the VI Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) VI Semester examination.
- (13) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester VI and has completed a regular course of study of the VII Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) VII Semester examination.
- (14) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester VII and has completed a regular course of study of the VIII Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) VIII Semester examination.
- (15) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester VIII and has completed a regular course of study of the IX Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) IX Semester examination.
- (16) A candidate who has obtained at least 50% marks in aggregate in at least 4 papers of Semester IX and has completed a regular course of study of the X Semester of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) shall be eligible to appear at the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) X Semester examination.
- (17) Instructions to each B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) class shall be imparted for a minimum period of seven hours every day on 4 days of a week, including one hour of seminar/ conference/debate, discussions. In addition one day of the week would be for Weekly Test of one hour duration in each paper. The 6 day of the week will be spent by the students on contact programmes with teachers and extension lectures, moot courts, seminars and other such personality development activities.
- (18) A candidate, who after passing all the 10 semester examinations of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) within eight years of his admission to Semester I of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) Course and has completed a regular course of study in the University teaching Department of Law, subject to a provision of the Act, Ordinance, Statutes, Rules and Regulations shall be awarded a degree of B.A., LL.B. (Hons.).

**B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) examination scheme [Regulation 21(a)] :**

In each of the B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) I semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) II semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) III semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) IV semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) V semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) VI semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) VII semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) VIII semester, B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) IX semester, and B.A., LL.B. (Hons.) X semester, a candidate must obtain for a pass not less than 50% marks in aggregate marks of the examination concerned; Provided that if a candidate fails to secure 40% marks in each of paper, he will be deemed to have failed in that paper. The marks in aggregate of the 10 semesters will be put together for classification of result. A candidate who is declared pass but obtained less than 60% marks would be placed in II Division and a candidate obtaining 60% or more marks would be placed in I Division."
